

Park Crossing Tennis Rules

Approved by Board of Directors at August 5, 2009 Meeting

Effective August 5, 2009

The Park Crossing Recreation Club (the "Club") is a private association that is open to Park Crossing homeowners who have elected to join and who remain in good standing. Resident Members are limited to 600. It is also open to an unlimited number of non-resident Associate Members, provided, however, that such Memberships are granted on a year by year basis and the Board may discontinue Associate Memberships at any time. Resident Members elect the Board of Directors at the Member's annual meeting.

Only Members, the Member's bona fide out-of-town guests, and Authorized and Paying Guests are allowed on the Club premises. The Member is the person who signs the application for membership and the Member's Family, consisting of spouse and children.

It is every Member's responsibility to know and follow the rules that govern the use of the Facility. The rules are intended to help (1) maintain the Facility in good condition, (2) provide the greatest utility for the greatest number of tennis playing Members, (3) fairly allocate court time, and (4) foster mutual respect and harmony among the Membership.

Court Reservations

To use a court, the Member must reserve the court. All reservations must be made on-line through www.reservemycourt.com, or by calling reservemycourt.com at 1-877-ON-COURT (1-877-662-6878). There are no paper sign-ups. Attached are the instructions for creating an account and making and deleting reservations.

Same Day Reservations and Walk-Up Play

You may reserve a court on the same day of play. Simply use a computer or telephone to make your reservation. Print your confirmation and bring it to the court if you can.

If you walk up without a reservation and see an open court, call reservemycourt.com to check its availability (1-800-662-6878). If the court is not reserved, then you may reserve it. If it is reserved, but at least 2 players from the reserving Member's party do not arrive within 10 minutes of the start time, then the reservation is forfeited and the court becomes available for play by the walk-up Member.

Priority Reservations

No reservations may be made more than 7 days in advance except the following. The Pro may schedule clinics and lessons more than 7 days in advance, and per the Club's agreement with the Pro, the Pro has access to half the playable courts at all times (3 during the day and 2 in the evening). Queen City league matches and approved USTA team matches will be scheduled at the start of each season for the entire season.

No-Shows

Members are expected to cancel their reservations in advance as soon as they learn they will not use the court. If a Member repeatedly fails to cancel reservations, the Committee may suspend the Member's reservation privileges.

Attire

Proper tennis attire is required. Only shoes with non-marking soles are allowed. Shoes and shirts are required at all times.

Tennis Only

The tennis courts and backboard area are for tennis only. No non-tennis activities are allowed, including but not limited to roller skating, roller blading, bicycling, skateboarding, or lacrosse. Pets are not allowed on the tennis courts.

Clay Court Maintenance

The Pro is responsible for sweeping the clay courts and lines once each day. Each Member is responsible for preparing his or her own court for play. After using a clay court, the Member is invited to sweep the court and the lines as a courtesy to the next party.

Authorized and Paying Guests

Any Member (the "Host") may play with one Authorized and Paying Guest per session. An Authorized and Paying Guest is a person who the Club has not barred as a guest and for whom the Host has paid the guest fee before the start of play. The guest fee is \$5 for each guest for each session. The fee is paid by placing the fee in an envelope, writing the names of the Host and the guest, the time of play, and depositing the envelope in the envelope slot in the Clubhouse front door.

Each Member and Member's Beneficiary is responsible for paying the guest fee each time a guest plays, and for paying before play starts.

Failure to so pay the guest fee can result in suspension of the membership rights of the Member and the Member's Family.

Queen City Teams

The Club will sponsor Queen City teams as Members request, subject to court availability. According to Queen City rules, each player on a PCRC Queen City team must be a Member.

USTA Teams

No USTA team may play at Park Crossing without the Tennis Committee's written advance approval. Approval must be obtained by each team for each season. To request approval, provide the Pro with the roster, days of play, number of lines for each match, and the deadline for registering the team.

Each player on a PCRC USTA team must be a Member. If, however, a team cannot fill its roster with Members for a season, the team may apply for a hardship exception for such season. To qualify for the hardship, the team must demonstrate that it offered roster spots to all qualified Members. The Tennis Committee may grant a hardship exception in the exercise of its sole and absolute discretion. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event can more than twenty-five percent (25%) of a USTA team's rostered players may be non-Members. If a hardship exception is granted, then before the season starts, the USTA team shall pay to the Club a fee of \$50 for each non-Member for that season. Any hardship exception granted and fee paid applies only to one season.

Ineligible Guests and USTA Players

Notwithstanding any of the above, someone who either (1) is a Park Crossing resident or (2) has been a former Member for less than 2 years, may not be a guest or a player on a PCRC USTA team.
